£4700	£4700	£0	SSP Membership (2yrs)	56% of KS1 children have attended an inter-school sports competition since Sept 2018. All children throughout school access interschool competition via multiskills sessions. All teachers have been given training in house to use learning nutrition to plan high quality PE lessons and PE lead has had termly mentoring sessions to challenge PE lead, to further accelerate the high quality provision within school. We were also the first infant school in the SSP to receive the Platinum Sporting Stars award.
£500	£545	-£45	Maths of the Day	Cross-curricular links are made between maths and P.E. and children are active within lessons. This is also being used to form part of home learning to encourage active learning at home.
£1,200	£1410	-£410	Play active coordination club	Targeted pupils show increased enjoyment of physical activity and participation in team games. They also show greater fitness levels, growth in confidence and have developed friendships through the club. The children thoroughly enjoy the club, eagerly anticipating it throughout the week and frequently talk about how much they love it! Parental feedback has also been really positive with parents commenting on how it has helped their child's confidence, improved fitness and their social circle.

£200	£55	£145	Intra sport comps - release time	Children enjoy termly challenges working cooperatively within their team and competitively between teams.

£200	£200	£0	PE lead time to monitor T&L in PE	Teachers are using tiered S/C and learning nutrition to plan high quality PE lessons.
£200	£0	£0	Healthy Schools budget	The healthy schools team (The Healthy Squad) is prominent across the school and engage children with events to highlight the importance of health and well-being. Incentives are given to children making healthy choices and children to continue to enjoy our “healthy menu”, in response to the govt paper Childhood Obesity :Chapter 2
£300	£0	£0	Smoooga Resources	An outdoor timetable has been devised to allow our sports apprentice to support the children in their play. Resources have not been needed although this money is earmarked for when they are. Having had positive playtimes, children are happier and show a greater readiness to learn after break times.
£400	£37	£367	Replace/repair eqpt	Children have access to a wide range of age appropriate equipment to support their physical development and their creativity. Access to high quality resource also allows teachers to be more creative in the planning and teaching of PE. YR will be purchasing outdoor equipment.
£2,000	£0	£2000	Develop Y1 outside area	Transition from reception to year 1 has been smoother, especially for children who prefer learning in the outdoor environment. However, the year 1 team has decided that the current year 1 outside area does not currently promote high quality learning and therefore needs more time for careful planning and development.

£50	£0	£50	Resources - FMC	Fine motor control boxes are used in every class across the school to support children's fmc development. Children can access these independently and with adult support to extend and challenge. Order will be place during summer term.
£100	£0	£0	Staff CPD	Staff are more engaged in teaching PE and LN scores are improved. Staff questionnaires highlight that Gym training is needed which will be happening in April.
£2,350	£2361	-£11	Sound System - hall	Fewer technical issues has meant that lessons are not disrupted by ICT failure, and therefore learning is enhanced. A wide range of music is available and this has also enhanced assemblies and school plays etc.
£120	£0	£120	Spotify Premium	Currently the basic Spotify package is meeting our needs as a school, so there has been no need to upgrade to the Premium package.
£2,000	£300	£1700	PE storage	Lessons are more organised as access to resources is easier. A selection of resources have been placed outside to allow easy access to resources at lunchtime and during outside PE.
£200	£180	£20	Water bottles	Children have access to water throughout the day to aid concentration. As bottles are clear, parents and children are more inclined to bring water to school, helping to develop healthy drinking habits.
£6,000	£8593	-£2593	Sports Apprentice	Greater support for teaching and learning available in PE lessons - children make expected or better than expected progress in PE. Children are active within play at break times. All children will have engaged in a virtual challenge.
£1,000	£1000	£0	Gymnastics training	All staff are attending gymnastics inset training. This is in response to staff surveys which showed that gymnastics was the area in which staff felt the least confident to teach.
£500	£500	£0	Dance workshops	Children all enjoyed the RE based dance workshops which allowed

				them to make cross curricular links between PE, geography and RE.
£250	£230	£20	Canopy for play slide	Children are able to use slide in summer without burning their legs.
£100	£0	£100	Sports based events - termly	Team days are enjoyed by all and not restricted by lack of resources.
£100	£105	-£5	Staff PE kit	Staff all look professional and smart during PE lessons to create a professional atmosphere. All staff wear kits during PE lessons, demonstrating to children the importance of wearing appropriate clothing to keep us safe and allow us participate fully in the lesson.
	£166	-£166	Well Being Books	Children are more focussed and are well hydrated and develop healthy drinking habits.
	£147	-£147	HI - Vis	All children wear hi-vis jackets to and from school to help them stay safe and due to parking restriction all children now have to walk a greater distance to school than previously. Bike and scooter racks are well used.
