It is has not been announced yet if the Sports Premium Funding will continue into the next academic year (21/22). However, the large majority of the unspent Sport Premium Funding from this year will likely be used to develop and improve the outdoor learning provision in YR and Y1. This will allow the outdoor early learning skills to continue to develop in an engaging and supporting outdoor learning environment. Announcement regarding change to the Sports Premium funding are usually made in July.
